It has been part of the Public Education system for over 110 years and assists students in becoming confident and creative individuals. It helps build a sense of self-worth, self-awareness and personal identity, assists them in managing their emotional, mental, spiritual and physical wellbeing. They explore age appropriate Bible stories, the life of Jesus and discover for themselves the relevance of the Christian faith. CRI assists students to question, explore and discover the Christian faith for themselves.

At Highfields State School we offer a program that is based on learning about our wonderful God who loves them. The program reinforces core values of responsibility, understanding, respect, tolerance, inclusion, integrity, freedom, compassion and caring. At the beginning of 2022, there were 621 student enrolments for Years 1 to 6 and 431 students currently opted in to CRI. The percentage enrolled in CRI 69.4%

We thank God for His generosity and trust Him to provide our needs.






Our "Serve Tree"
